Registration Information

Courses and sections may close at any time during the registration process and you may not be informed of closings until you are registering. Be prepared to select alternate sections or alternate courses. In the event a class must be cancelled due to insufficient enrollment, the students enrolled in that class will be advised as early as possible. Another course may be added and any necessary schedule adjustments may be done during the normal drop/add period and with no charge for the procedure.

DROP/ADD PERIOD ENDS Wednesday, January 26, 2012

Any drops on or after January 26 will be listed as a “W” (withdrawal) on your transcript. Full-time students must have their advisor’s signature on all drop/add forms. Lab and course fees are not refundable (full or part-time students) if the student drops the course after the one-week drop/add period. If you are adding a course after the scheduled add/drop period, you must have the instructor of the course sign your add/drop form before you return it to the Registrar’s Office.

NOTE:

A withdrawn course remains on the student’s schedule and is counted toward full-time tuition. However, the credits from a course that is dropped during the Add/Drop Period are subtracted from the total number of credits for the semester. If a student drops below 12 credits (full-time status), the student is then considered to be matriculating part-time, which will impact their financial aid reward.

REPEATING COURSES

If you wish to repeat a course taken at Cabrini, fill out the “REPEAT COURSE” form in the Cavalier Express Center when you register for the class. The original grade will remain on your transcript, but your overall GPA will reflect the new grade.

Independent & Directed Studies

Independent study & directed study forms are available in the Cavalier Express Center, the office of Academic Affairs and the office of Graduate Studies. Return the completed forms to Academic Affairs for the Academic Dean’s signature. That office will send a copy of the form to the Office of the Registrar, at which time we will register you for the course.

NOTE:

There is an additional fee charged for an independent study.

Pass/Fail

The pass/fail option is available to juniors and seniors for their elective courses only. Students may take one course a semester on a pass/fail basis and must declare their pass/fail in the Cavalier Express Center prior to the last day of class.

Your catalog

Students must follow the provisions of the Cabrini College catalog under which he/she originally enrolled at Cabrini, unless the student is returning for study after an education leave of one year or greater. Students should refer to the Cabrini College catalog for course descriptions, prerequisites, and credit hours before registering.

Instructor/classroom changes

Room changes will occur. Students should check the Current Course Schedule page of Cabrini's website (www.cabrini.edu/registrar) to check current room assignments. Faculty names and room assignments are subject to change.

Affiliations with SEPCHE Colleges

Affiliations are among the special studies options offered to full-time students during the Fall and Spring semesters at no additional tuition (fees for course materials may be assessed by the host college). Students must follow the registration procedures, drop/add procedures, academic calendars, policies, and regulations of the host institutions. The courses taken and the credits earned are reported on the student's Cabrini College grade report and academic transcript. Grades are calculated according to Cabrini's quality point scale. For more information, additional course offerings, course descriptions, and faculty listings, contact Cabrini's Office of the Registrar.

In addition to the existing agreements with Eastern College and Valley Forge Junior College, Cabrini College has entered into an agreement with the colleges of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Consortium for Higher Education. Those institutions are: Arcadia University, Chestnut Hill College, Gwynedd-Mercy College, Holy Family College, Immaculata College, Neumann College, and Rosemont College.

This agreement is similar to the existing agreements, but stop by The Office of the Registrar in Grace Hall for details. Ask for information about "SEPCHE cross-registration". Students are eligible if they are full-time students and have completed one-year as a full-time student at Cabrini.

ENG 329A: Women & Sexuality

3 credits

Course Description:

- *In this women's studies class, students will explore how women's sexuality has been a site of abuse, reproduction, pleasure, political control, perversion, and subversive agency. Students will consider how theories and viewpoints on women's sexuality and violence against women are shaped by cultural assumptions about race, class, gender, religion, and sexual orientation. The course will engage the study of theoretical texts like Foucault's *The History of Sexuality*, literature like Hawthorne's *The Scarlet Letter* and Kate Chopin's "The Storm," and current issues in women's sexuality such as human trafficking and sex work that has enslaved millions of young women worldwide. 3 credits*

HENG 292A: Reacting to Past: Advance Master Class

3 Credits –

Course Description:

- *This course engages students in "Reacting to the Past," a teaching method developed originally at Barnard College and now used in college classrooms across the country. "Reacting" calls on students to play out the parts of historical figures in key moments of cultural and political crisis. Students inhabit their roles, getting into the minds and hearts of those historical individuals they portray. Public speaking and writing "in character" are essential features of the "reacting" method. This course is primarily designed for veterans of "reacting" who have worked with the pedagogy in other courses; however, motivated students who are new to "Reacting" are also welcome. Course enrollment is limited to Honors students. 3 credits*

SOW212A: Family Violence

3 credits

Course Description:

- *This course aims to uncover the dynamics involved in the taboo subject of family violence. The underlying values and norms related to family, community, the state, and society are explored as they shape and, sometimes constrain, responses to children and others affected by family violence. The course provides an overview of the various forms of family violence and approaches to understanding their effects on family members, with particular emphasis on child witnesses to domestic violence. Social, economic, and political factors are critically examined. Intervention approaches, such as risk assessment and maximizing collaboration among community resources, are addressed. 3 credits*
