

IMPORTANT REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Application to Graduate

Students expecting to graduate in May 2013 should have filed an application to graduate with the Registrar's Office. If you have not completed the application, you should do so immediately. Bachelor's degree candidates can find the form at www.cabrini.edu/registrar and should submit it to the Registrar's Office in the Cavalier Express Center immediately. Please note that completion and submission of the form does not represent final approval to graduate in May 2013 and should not be interpreted as a guarantee that you have completed all requirements for graduation.

Federal Student Loan Exit Session with Financial Aid

Students who borrowed a Federal Student Loan while at Cabrini are required to complete the exit counseling session by Monday, April 1, 2013. The Financial Aid Office will email instructions for completing the online session. Those who fail to complete this requirement will be unable to obtain Commencement materials or to graduate, and will have a hold placed on their transcripts by the Financial Aid Office. If you have any questions, or if you are not sure that you borrowed a Federal Student Loan, contact the Cavalier Express Center at 610-902-8188.

Outstanding Financial Obligations with the Business Office

Students with outstanding financial obligations to the College must settle their accounts with the Business Office in order to receive Commencement materials, participate in graduation, receive a diploma and/or access their transcripts. All prospective graduates are strongly encouraged to check the status of their student account and pay any remaining balances immediately. If you have any questions about your student account, call the Cavalier Express Center at 610-902-8188.

Insufficient Credits to Graduate and Commencement Participation

Students who are within six credits of meeting all requirements for graduation may still participate in the graduation ceremony if they have enrolled in the remaining course(s) at Cabrini College, and have submitted a petition for permission to participate. Undergraduate students should submit their petition to a representative in the Cavalier Express Center/Registrar's Office. The petition should be addressed to the Dr. Mary Harris. Petitions must be received no later than Friday, March 29, 2013. *Please note that written permission to participate in the Commencement Ceremony (permission to walk) must be obtained before students can receive their academic attire or other items related to graduation.* Students who have been granted permission to walk will have their name listed in the Commencement program with a notation next to their name indicating "degree to be awarded at a later date."

DISTRIBUTION OF GRADUATION MATERIAL AT COMMENCEMENT KICK-OFF

Bring Student ID and allow one hour.

Commencement Kick-Off is a "one-stop shopping" experience, where prospective graduates can clear any financial obligations to the College and obtain all Commencement related materials such as academic attire, parking passes, printed graduation announcements, and tickets to senior week events. Please note the dates and times for Commencement Kick-Off (see schedule of events at left).

Printed Announcements: Each graduate will receive five (5) professionally printed Commencement announcements at no cost. Additional announcements may be requested at Commencement Kick-Off. Admission tickets are not required for the graduation ceremony. Announcements are notifications of Graduation to be mailed to family and friends.

Commencement Parking Passes:

Parking will be limited the day of Commencement. Parking passes will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis during Commencement Kick-Off. Prospective graduates will receive a maximum of two parking passes. Requests for handicapped passes should be directed to the Public Safety staff members at Commencement Kick-Off. Students requiring a handicapped pass will be issued one in lieu of one traditional guest pass.

Videotaping: Commencement will be professionally videotaped by *Short Productions*. From Bagpipe Procession (close-up shot of each student entering), to Student Speakers, to the Address, to each student receiving their degree on stage, *Short Productions* will record, edit, and distribute the entire Commencement on DVD. Undergraduate parents/family will receive pre-order forms in the mail prior to graduation. You can also order on Commencement Day in person at the table located by the tent. Photography: Every participant in the commencement ceremony will be professionally photographed by GradImages®. Picture proofs will be e-mailed and mailed to each graduate after the ceremony. Prior to Commencement, visit www.gradimages.com, click on "Pre-Event Registration" tab at the top and enter your valid e-mail address. By completing the pre-event registration, you will receive a code for \$5 off orders of \$25 or more! The photos will feature an image of the graduate being congratulated by College President Marie Angelella George at the ceremony, a ceremony portrait and close-up photograph.

Diploma Frames: The Bookstore has a variety of frames to enhance the look of your diploma. Frames that are in stock will be available for purchase at Commencement Kick-Off on a first-come, first-served basis. Orders for frames also can be placed at that time. To see the

frames prior to the kick-off event, visit the Bookstore on the lower level of the Widener Center.

Honors Medals: Undergraduate students graduating with Latin honors (cum laude, magna cum laude and summa cum laude) will be identified by the Registrar's Office in early April. Medals for Latin honors, which are to be worn at graduation, will be distributed at Commencement Kick-Off. In the event there is a change in a student's cumulative GPA, which would affect their Latin honors, students may exchange the Latin honors medal received at Commencement Kick Off for the appropriate medal. To exchange a medal, visit the Registrar's Office by Friday May 17, 2013.

ACADEMIC ATTIRE: DEGREES, HOODS AND TASSELS

Academic attire for graduation will be distributed at Commencement Kick-Off, after staff at the Registrar's Office, Financial Aid and Business Office tables have certified that students have no outstanding obligations. NOTE: the Bookstore cannot distribute attire prior to receiving those clearances. Graduates will receive a cap and gown, a black cap tassel and a hood in the appropriate color for their degree (see left). Blue-and-white Cabrini cap tassels can be purchased at the Bookstore. Attire can be kept by the graduates after the ceremony.

Attire and Procession: Graduates should report to the Nerney Field House in the Dixon Center NO LATER THAN 3:30 p.m.

that day to line up for the procession. The procession will begin promptly at 4 p.m. Attire for the Mass consists of the graduation gown only; do not wear the cap, hood, honors medals, cords or sashes. As the procession will involve walking over lawn areas, women are advised to wear low-heeled shoes. Please plan to leave nothing of value in the Field House when the procession starts.

Seating for Graduates: When lining up for the procession, the person you would like to sit next to should line up immediately in front of or behind you, as the double procession line will divide right and left upon reaching the seating area.

COMMENCEMENT INFORMATION FOR GRADUATES

Graduate Reporting Instructions:

Bachelor's degree candidates should report to the Nerney Field House in the Dixon Center for the Commencement ceremony, NO LATER THAN 9:15 a.m. Upon arrival, students should locate the area for their major, which will be marked with an appropriate sign. Bachelor's double-degree majors should report to the area of their first major.

Attire: Graduates should report wearing their academic attire. Hooding will be completed by the faculty in each major. Undergraduate honors medals should be worn around the neck. No jewelry, flowers or other adornments should be evident on attire. Cap tassels should be placed to the right, then moved to the left after the awarding of degrees.

Name Card: At the reporting areas for their majors, graduates will receive an index card containing a label with their name on it, which they will hand to the individual reading names as students ascend the stage to be congratulated by the President. If a pre-labeled card is not available for you at your major reporting area, it is important that you take one of the blank index cards available, clearly write your name on it and bring it with you to the ceremony, so that you can hand it to the person reading names when you reach the stage

Procession Line-Up: Commencement assistants will be available to issue instructions to the graduates about lining up for the procession. Graduates will be lined up by major and degree group, so that individuals receiving the same degree are seated together for the ceremony. If you wish to sit next to someone, he/she should line up immediately in front of or behind you because the line will divide right and left upon reaching the seating area. The procession will leave the Dixon Center promptly at 9:50 a.m.

Diplomas: Diplomas will not be distributed at Commencement, but will be available in the Registrar's Office, in the Cavalier Express Center during the last week of June. Please call 610-902-8545 before coming to the office to pick up your diploma. A photo ID must be presented by you or your proxy when picking up the diploma in person. You may arrange to have your diploma mailed to you by making your request in writing to: Registrar's Office, Cabrini College, 610 King of Prussia Road, Radnor, PA 19087.

Commencement Decorum: While Commencement is a celebration for Cabrini graduates, it is important for students to recognize that it also is a formal academic ceremony to be conducted with dignity and decorum. Graduates are asked to celebrate their accomplishments in a way that recognizes the importance of being courteous to fellow graduates and their guests, as well as the speakers, and does not disrupt the ceremony. Courtesy also requires that graduates remain in their seats during the ceremony, until instructed to move to the stage area. Cell phones should be turned off during the ceremony.

Reserved Seating Available to Legacy Families: Reserved seating at the Commencement ceremony and a special photograph with President Marie Angelella George are available to all legacy families. Seating is limited to four seats per family. A Cabrini legacy is a student or alumnus whose parent, grandparent or sibling has graduated from Cabrini College. Commencement Ceremony Parking:

Parking on the main campus will be very limited, and only cars displaying an appropriate pass (see Parking Passes under Commencement Kick-Off) will be permitted to park at Cabrini. Additional parking will be available on the campus of Eastern University for graduates and their guests who display the Cabrini Commencement parking pass in their cars. Shuttle service to Commencement from the Eastern lots will be available beginning at 8 a.m. for the Bachelor's degree ceremony. Return service to the Eastern lots also will be available following Commencement. Incoming drop-off and pick-up for individuals will be permitted adjacent to the graduation area. Individuals who are unable to walk from the parking lots to the Commencement site are encouraged to use the shuttle service.

Handicapped Parking: Individuals who are ambulatory should plan to use the shuttle service (see above). Guests in wheelchairs may be dropped off adjacent to the graduation area. There will be a limited number of parking spots in the Dixon Center lot for those vehicles with appropriate handicapped parking passes or placards. Requests for handicapped passes can be directed to the public safety officer staffing the parking pass table at Commencement Kick-Off. Because parking passes are limited to two per graduate, students requiring a handicapped pass will be issued one in lieu of a traditional guest pass.

Disability Accommodations:

Graduates who require special disability accommodations, unrelated to parking, for themselves or for their guests, should contact the Office of Student Development at 610-902-8416 by April 2, 2013. Advance notification is especially important if a sign language interpreter is required.

Restrooms: Restroom facilities for Commencement will be available in the Dixon Center, the Widener Center, and Grace Hall, all located adjacent to the site of the ceremony.

Guest Seating: There are no admission tickets for the graduation ceremony and each graduate may invite as many guests as they wish to attend. Seating is available on a first-come, first-served basis. As a courtesy to other guests, we request that individuals who arrive early for the ceremony refrain from “reserving” more than two or three seats for other members of their party who have yet to arrive.

Commencement Etiquette: While Commencement is a celebration of our students’ accomplishments, it also is a formal academic event to be conducted with dignity and decorum. Guests are asked to remain in their seats for the duration of the ceremony

and to refrain from blocking aisles and passageways, including the area directly in front of the stage, by attempting to greet or take photos of individual graduates. Professional photos will be taken of each graduate as they ascend the stage to be congratulated by the College President, and may be purchased through the photographer after the ceremony. In support of our graduates, we also ask that you refrain from departing the ceremony early, especially after your own graduate has been recognized and there are others waiting to be recognized. Cell phones and related electronic equipment should be turned off during the ceremony.

Bookstore & Jazzman's Café: For the convenience of graduates and their families, the campus Bookstore will be open from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and Jazzman’s Café will be open from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. on the day of Commencement. Both are located on the lower level of the Widener Center.

Receptions: Following the ceremony, graduates, families and guests are cordially invited to enjoy light refreshments in the Nerney Field House at the Dixon Center.
