As a **History** major, you will develop skills in critical thinking, research, and writing across the disciplines—skills vital for effective communication and decision-making in many professional contexts. Majors gain a broader perspective of different times and places, an appreciation of human difficulties and accomplishments, and a realization of the underlying unity of the human experience.

Courses give meaning and integration to historical events, forming a basis for understanding contemporary issues. The curriculum helps develop habits of open inquiry, patient pursuit of knowledge, and objective, critical judgment.

By choosing a major in History, you open the door to a variety of career options in business, communication, government, law, social services, teaching, and archival professions.

We offer courses in United States, Latin American, European, and African history, as well as popular topics from the Vietnam War to Nazi Germany. Our small class sizes allow students to work one-on-one with faculty to conduct research.

In addition to traditional coursework and undergraduate research, students will have access to world-renowned scholars through our yearly Jolyon Pitt Girard Scholar-in-Residence series and our History Club Forum. Students also meet with and learn from women who have distinguished themselves in the fields of politics and public service through our annual Ivy Young Willis and Martha Willis Dale Lecture series.
