

## **LEARNING DISABILITY**

## **Documentation Requirements Needed for a Learning Disability:**

To document a Learning Disability, a student must submit a current report (3-5 years) based on a current comprehensive psychoeducational performed by a licensed psychologist or certified school psychologist. The report must clearly state that a learning disability exists, provide data and analysis substantiating the diagnosis, and verify the need for accommodations by identifying deficits that significantly affect academic performance.

At minimum, the following information must be included:

- An assessment of cognitive functioning based upon results of on the Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale-Revised (WAIS-R) or the Woodcock-Johnson Psychoeducational Battery-Revised: Tests of Cognitive Ability
- Data about specific areas of information processing (e.g. perceptual ability, memory, and processing speed)
- Information about academic achievement including current levels of reading, mathematics, writing, and spelling ability
- Analysis of evaluation results including individual scaled subtest scores
- Recommendations for appropriate accommodations to help compensate for the Learning Disability
