Primary Source Workshop

When we ask students to work with and learn from primary sources, we transform them into historians. Rather than passively receiving information from a teacher or textbook, students engage in the activities of historians – making sense of the stories, events and ideas of the past through document analysis. This workshop is an introductory level exploration of primary sources and the role of archives in providing access to primary sources. Concepts introduced and explored during the lesson include content, context, and significance as they relate to interpreting primary sources. The workshop will also consider the importance of citations in secondary sources, specifically citations that lead researchers back to primary sources. Students are exposed to traditional academic research conventions, such as the use of citations in scholarly texts

Read with Purpose
