An expert on the American presidency, the Civil War, and World War II, Hedtke has been a featured guest on multiple programs including *WHYY Newsworks Tonight*, *POTUS 2016(CUNY)*, *NBC10 In Focus*, and the *Christian Science Monitor*.

He has authored four books, *The Freckleton, England, Air Disaster*, *American Civil War: Facts and Fictions*, *Lame Duck Presidents: Myth or Reality*, and *Civil War Professional Soldiers, Citizen Soldiers and Native American Soldiers of Genesee County, New York: Ordinary Men of Valor*, the latter of which he edited and researched with students.

Hedtke earned a bachelor's degree from Saint Joseph’s University, a master’s from Villanova University, and a PhD from Temple University. He has taught at Cabrini since 1973.
