# OUR story STARTED WITH MOTHER CABRINI

An Italian immigrant, Mother Cabrini is the first American to be canonized a saint and the patron saint of immigrants. Her statue in Manhattan appears near the Statue of Liberty and Ellis Island.

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850–1917) built a humanitarian empire.

She established 67 schools, hospitals, and orphanages in her lifetime, and her legacy continues today on six continents and in 17 countries through the work of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a Roman Catholic religious order she founded.

Cabrini University has the elite distinction of being the only Cabrinian institution of higher education in the world.

Mother Cabrini insisted that a Cabrinian education link intellectual competence with moral development and instill a special concern for people in need.

Cabrini University continues this *Education of the Heart* by providing a liberal arts education mixed with hands-on learning, as well as a living and learning environment that develops leaders who can succeed professionally and contribute to their communities.


# Location, location, location!

2. Send your final official high school transcript.

**NOTE:** Transfer applicants must submit the official transcripts from all colleges attended. A final high school transcript is required if fewer than 24 college credits are completed.

### 3. Personal Statement

- If not using the Common App, please email a 250+ word personal statement, topic of your choice, to [essays@cabrini.edu](mailto:essays@cabrini.edu).
- The additional Nursing essay is a 250-word essay on why Nursing is your chosen profession.

### 4. Optional submissions:

- Letter of recommendation
- SAT (code 2071) or ACT (code 3532) scores

**NOTE:** Nursing is a test-optional program, but applicants are highly encouraged to submit SAT or ACT scores.

## CABRINI IS TEST OPTIONAL!\*

Your Admissions Counselor will consider your academic performance, your personal statement, and any other information about your life experiences, as well as a possible interview with the Director of Admissions, when reviewing your application. You're welcome to submit any test scores to be reviewed!

\*SAT, ACT, TOEFL, or IELTS scores **are required** for international students.
